FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

It seems we hear a great deal today about the subject of what is called "Christian Nationalism." That is when Christianity gets conflated with a form of patriotism, which believes that America should be a Christian country. Perhaps on one level, Christian people might hope for that. Our Lord said to go and make disciples of all nations. The reality of our nation, however, is that there are many Americans who follow a different spiritual and religious path, and believe in their way of knowing God.

In spite of the fact our nation was founded on the premise of religious liberty, those who follow Christian Nationalism believe that we need to reclaim America as a Christian country, and their ideas quickly lead them to think that all Christians think like them, and indeed all Christians look like them. Often the logic path of this argument leads to ideas about taking up arms to reclaim the country. Hence, events like the January 6th insurrection are happening. Some while back, our Presiding Bishop, Michael Curry, said that one of the ways we can work against this false ideology is to focus on the life and teachings of Jesus of Nazareth. Perhaps we can begin with the Sermon on the Mount and the Beatitudes.

Jesus was not a revolutionary military leader who tried to free Palestine from the Romans. He wasn't even a Christian himself, because Christianity did not exist. We can see him through many different lenses, including that of non-violent resistance. Jesus' non-violent response to those who plotted against him, and who finally had him executed, has been an inspiration for movements of non-violent resistance, which have enabled oppressed people in the U.S. and other countries to overcome injustice and racism.

My favourite scripture from Micah ends with the encapsulation of what it means to be a person of God. "What does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" That is what we see in Jesus of Nazareth. Not striving for power, not jockeying for position, but walking humbly with our God.

Ultimately this means loving everyone, regardless of skin color, gender expression, sexual preference, or preferred ideology. As we celebrate the birth of our nation on the 4th of July, let us pray that we are able to focus on Jesus' words. May His words speak for themselves and be our guide in all of our life.
