### FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

In November, many Christians around the world observe All Saints Sunday, which honors all saints of the church deemed to have attained heaven. In the Episcopal Church, our prayer for All Saints Day is: "O Almighty God, who has knit together thine elect in one communion and fellowship in the mystical body of thy Son Christ our Lord: Grant us grace so to follow thy

blessed saints in all virtuous and godly living, that we may come to those ineffable joys which thou hast prepared for those who unfeignedly love thee." In our church, a saint is a holy person, a faithful Christian, one who shares life in Christ. The term may also indicate one who has been formally canonized or recognized as a saint by church authority. In the New Testament, the term is applied to all faithful Christians (see Acts 9:32, 26:10). Paul addresses the saints, or those called to be saints, who are the members of Christian communities that receive his letters. Christ makes it possible for us to be saints as we share his life. We are washed, sanctified, and justified "in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God." (1 Cor 6:11) Saints are members of the church who have died, and are regarded as enjoying eternal happiness through union with God. They are the Church Triumphant. Believers who are still alive and still battling on for the Lord in this life are considered the Church Militant. In my time with you at Trinity Church, we have seen many of our dear brothers and sisters join the Church Triumphant. We remember them, and thank God for their example, encouragement, and blessing to our lives. They remain part of our history and community, and we thank God for them. As we gather on the first Sunday of November for All Saints Sunday, let the memory and blessing of those who have gone before us give us strength and dedication to the call of our Lord.
